Call2recycle Program to Recycle Used Batteries:

The Town of Florenceville-Bristol has partnered with Call2Recycle to make convenient battery recycling available to the community of Florenceville-Bristol. The only no-cost battery and cellphone collection program in North America, Call2Recycle helps communities like *Florenceville-Bristol* operate curbside pick-up and household battery and cellphone collection programs. There is a drop box location at 19 Station Road. Batteries and cell phones can be dropped off Monday-Friday, 8am-4pm. Learn more at call2recycle.ca or 877-2-RECYCLE.

Household Hazardous Waste:

There is no charge for residents to drop-off their household hazardous waste. Simply collect the materials, pack them carefully in your vehicle and transport them to one of the listed locations. Garbage Pick-up:

Residential garbage is picked up curbside on Thursdays (except on Recycling Blue Bin pick-up day).

Large garbage pick-up is scheduled twice a year, normally after Thanksgiving and after Victoria Day. Please check the J.S. Bellis website for the most up-to-date Special Clean-up Schedule.

PLEASE NOTE: The following items will NOT be picked up:

- Refrigerators & Freezers, Propane Tanks
- Liquid Waste of Any Kind (Paint, Solvents, Oil, Etc.)
- Toxic Material Of Any Kind
- Motor Vehicle Parts (including batteries & tires)
- Construction & Demolition Waste Exceeding 180 kgs. All C&D waste must be bundled in units not exceeding 27 kgs (60 pounds & not exceed 4 feet in length)

All items must be securely tied or boxed.

Recycling:

Residential Curbside Recycling is available in the Town of Florenceville-Bristol. Note that regular garbage pick-up does not occur on Recycling Pick-up Day. Please check the Western Valley Regional Service Commission's website for the calendar schedule and recycling details.
